#### **Crim 160 Canadian Law**

We are seeking a casual instructor to instruct Crim.160 Canadian Law. This 3 credit course will present a critical overview of the Canadian legal System; a history of Canadian legal system; constitutional law; administrative law; contracts; tort law; and family law. The doctrine of precedent; statutory interpretation; law reform and the Canadian legal system's effect on Indigenous people is examined throughout.

#### **Crim 180 Sociological Approaches to Crime**

This 3-credit course examines crime and deviance using the tools of Sociology and Criminology. A critical examination of Indigenous experience with the criminal justice system is included. Innovative justice programs are examined. We will look specifically at a number of criminalized or stigmatized social issues such as poverty and homelessness.

The courses will be delivered in-class on either a Tuesday or Friday from 9:00 am to 2:30 pm.

#### **Qualifications:**

Any combination of education and work experience as follows will be considered:

- Bachelor's degree in a related field; at least 2 years-experience in criminology or related field.
- Significant teaching experience, preferably in the post-secondary education system;
- Excellent verbal, written and computer communication skills;
- Knowledge of Indigenous values, communities and instructional methodology, and experience working with Indigenous organizations and Indigenous adults
